Fr. Charles's Corner...

This weekend's readings take us back to the basics, reminding us how we as Christians are to approach our relationship with God and others.

The First Reading gives us an early glimpse of the extravagance of God's mercy revealed in the very first book of the Old Testament. In this passage from Genesis, we find Abraham testing the limits of God's kindness and patience with His people. God tells Abraham that despite the terrible depravity in Sodom and Gomorrah, for the sake of just a handful of innocent people, He would spare them all. What an infinitely loving God we have!

The Gospel reading from Luke takes us back to the basics of prayer, offering us both a method of prayer from Jesus Himself and the encouragement to persist in prayer. In this passage, some of His disciples ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus instantly offers them the beautiful prayer which we, of course, call the Our Father. This prayer is so rich that it still forms the basis of our approach to God the Father over 2,000 years later. At the same time, it is so simple, we teach it as a first prayer to young children.

In the Oure Father, we call upon God in an intimate way, as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, everything is His, and our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim that we trust completely in His provision for us and mercy towards us. We, too, commit to extending mercy ourselves (as we forgive those who sin against us).

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we recognize this basic truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children.

After giving us the Our Father, Jesus shares the story of the man who bugs his neighbor for bread in the middle of the night. The man's persistence pays off. How much more perfectly the Father will answer the prayers of His children when we persist in going to Him with our needs.

At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus offers one more "basic" for us about our relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, knock on His door! He can hardly wait to bless us, HIs children. Remember that this week, then go, be a blessing to others!

WHAT IS OUR HOUSE OF MERCY?

The "House of Mercy" of Our Lady of Guadalupe is a permanent shelter for male beneficiaries who are mentally handicapped and with physical movement disorders. Currently, the children and adults who attend have different pathologies and disabilities such as Down syndrome, Alzheimer's, Autism, mental retardation, etc.

Our home is an institution guided by the principles of Jesus Christ. That is why we try to serve the most helpless, the poorest and those who are sometimes in desperate situations. The scope of our service wants to be as vast as the mercy of Christ.



On December 12, 2006 feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we received the formal permission to found a House of Mercy and the following year on April 15, 2007 Divine Mercy Sunday, this home was officially inaugurated and is currently located in King Mariout, on the outskirts of Alexandria, Egypt.

CITY OF CHARITY

The Home "Our Lady of Guadalupe" is part of a larger project, which we call "the City of Charity". This "City" does not consist in a specific physical space, but in the coordination of all the charitable works of the Religious Family of the Incarnate Word. For this reason, this House of Mercy is currently and jointly working with the two Houses of Mercy: "Blessed Catalina Troiani" and "Divino Niño".



VOLUNTEERS

In this home we also try to give the possibility to those who want to volunteer. They are able to experience what Our Lord Jesus Christ said through the mouth of St. Paul "there is more joy in giving than in receiving", and therefore, they can make a work of mercy in order to receive the mercy of God.

MASS INTENTION POLICY

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, or a specific intention, is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition. The following policy was implemented in order to accommodate the numerous Mass requests in a reasonable and fair manner.

- 1. The Mass Intention Book will open on August 1st for 2026.
- Until November 1st we will accept no more than 12 single intention requests from a household for 2025. (Unlimited requests for Sunday or Saturday Masses will be accepted.) After November 1st all intentions will be accepted until the schedule is full.
- 3. Mass requests will be honored on a first-come, first-serve basis in the order in which the request is received at the parish office.
- 4. No Mass request will be taken over the telephone. Mass requests must be made in person in the parish office, or in writing and placed in the collection basket or drop box outside of the parish office. Requests may also be mailed to the office. Forms for requesting a Mass can be obtained from the parish office, in the back of the church, or available online on the parish website.
- 5. A \$5 stipend—established by the archdiocese—is to accompany each Mass request. The stipend is a gift to the Church for the Mass intention. At present, St. Benedict Church will continue bearing the costs associated in sending a card to the person for whom the Mass is being offered, or if the person is deceased, to their next of kin.
- 6. Canon Law requires that only one intention per Mass is allowed except for two Masses each week when the pastor can allow multiple intentions. These multiple intention Masses are designated for weekends.
- 7. Intentions must be specific and deliberate: "special intention" or "private intentions" will not be accepted. Lengthy intention listings cannot be published in the Bulletin and must be edited for the sake of brevity. Also, when the intention is for a family, up to three first names with the same last name (i.e. John, Paul and Mary Smith) or the parents' first names and last name (i.e. John and Mary Smith Family) should be used.
- 8. Mass intentions will not be rescheduled if a verbal announcement was not heard during Mass. The priest celebrant is under the strict obligation to remember the intention for which the Mass is being offered and it is presumed that the priest will offer the Mass as requested. The intention is a spiritual act and its verbal publication neither adds nor subtracts from its validity.
- 9. All intention requests are subject to acceptance by the pastor, who will also have the final determination of the wording of any intention.
- 10. Mass requests will be granted as close to the requested date and time as possible. If it is not possible to comply with the primary request, the next closest date and time will be scheduled.
- 11. Please remember the Mass intention is only a request. Once the Mass is scheduled we will do our best to celebrate the Mass on the day and time scheduled. However, this may not be possible because of unforeseen circumstances. In this case the next available date and time will be scheduled. Attempts will be made to contact the concerned parties ahead of time, but please note that this is not always possible.




