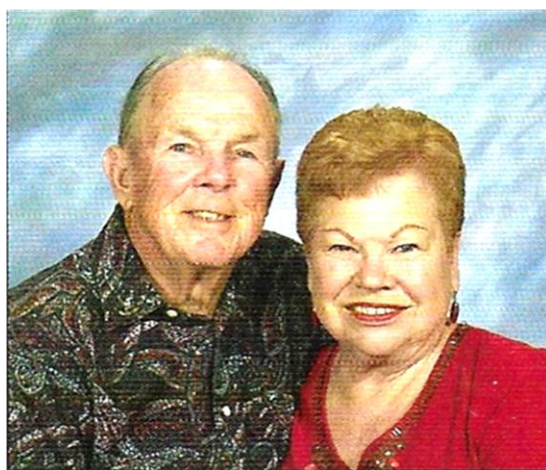
atmosphere with fellow brothers. And please don't forget the delicious desserts supplied by the ladies!

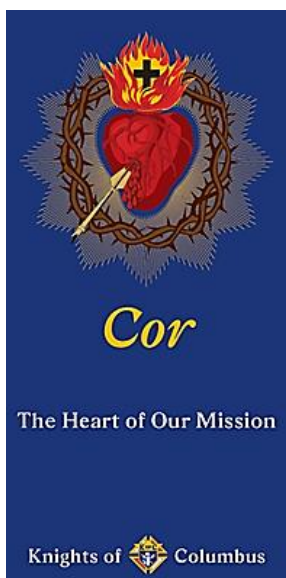

THINGS IN THE WORKS

- During this time of year as we approach Lent, our calendar is dominated by the Fish Fry Dinners. Each Friday during Lent we will be offering those dinners for sale from 4 – 7 p.m. at our unchanged price of \$12. Please consider volunteering to help out if you possibly can.
- The chalice pictured here was used by Pope St. John Paul II in the celebration of Mass in 2000 in St. Peter's Basilica. It was provided then by the Louisiana Knights of Columbus, who are now its caretakers. The chalice will be at St. John's where it will be used in the celebration of all weekend Masses on February 7th & 8th. It will also be available after each of those Masses for you to visit up close and to touch with your rosary or other sacramental – and thus make those items third class relics.
- Coincident with the Pope St. John Paul II Chalice exhibit, our council will, at all Masses that weekend, be conducting a State KC-sponsored "Proof of Concept" Membership Drive, inviting all men of our parish to consider becoming Knights and join our council.

CHRISTMAS PARTY

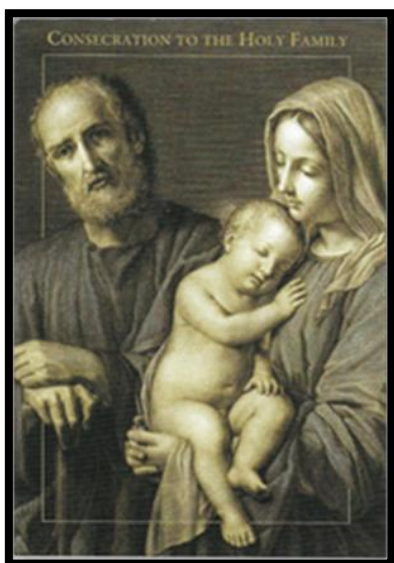

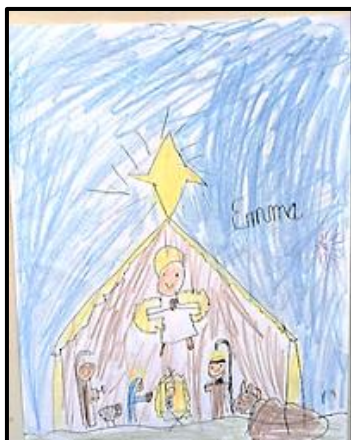
